How to Appeal the Loss of Enrollment Priority and/or CCPG Waiver Eligibility

Carefully read each of the sections below. If you feel you meet the requirements for an exception to the regulations you may complete and file the form entitled *Loss of Enrollment Priority and/or CCPG Waiver Appeal.* You must attach a typed narrative of the reasons for the appeal, required documentation and a copy of your approved College of Marin Student Education Plan created by a counselor. Appeals submitted without sufficient documentation will be denied. **Submit all documents in a single packet to the Enrollment Services Office** at either the Kentfield Campus or the Indian Valley Campus.

In order to receive enrollment priority for the next semester your petition must be submitted at least three (3) weeks before the start of priority registration.

Loss of Enrollment Priority

Students who have complete the matriculation process: Orientation, Assessment Testing and creating a Student Education Plan with a counselor are given priority registration. However, this priority is lost at the first registration opportunity after a student is placed on academic progress probation for two consecutive semester or has earned 90 or more degree-applicable units at COM.

Loss of Eligibility for the CA College Promise Grant (CCPG)

Students who are eligible for the CCPG Fee Waiver may lose their eligibility if they fail to sustain a GPA of 2.0 or higher and complete more than 50 percent of their coursework. If a student's cumulative GPA falls below 2.0 for two consecutive primary terms (fall or spring) the student will be placed on academic probation. If the cumulative number of units completed is not more than 50 percent in two consecutive primary terms, the student is placed on progress probation. Any combination of two consecutive primary terms of academic or progress probation may result in loss of fee waiver eligibility.

How to Regain Enrollment Priority and/or CA College Promise Grant (CCPG) Eligibility

If you lose enrollment priority and/or CCPG eligibility you must attend and complete a <u>Loss of CCPG Fee Waiver</u> <u>Workshop</u> **AND** <u>meet one or more of the following conditions</u>:

- ✓ Improve your GPA and course completion rate to meet academic and progress standards
- ✓ Successful appeal regarding extenuating circumstances
- ✓ Successful appeal based on significant academic improvement
- ✓ Not attending COM for two consecutive primary terms (fall/spring)

The appeals process for extenuating circumstances includes:

- ✓ Verified accidents, illness or other circumstances beyond your control
- ✓ Changes in economic situation
- ✓ Evidence of inability to obtain essential support services
- ✓ Special consideration for CalWORKs, EOPS, SAS and student Veterans
- ✓ Disability accommodations not received in a timely manner

Foster youth, former foster youth (age 24 years and younger) and Veterans are not subject to the loss of the CCPG Fee Waiver under these regulation.
