9. Enrollment and Verification to the VA monthly

Beginning Dec 17, 2021: The Department of Veterans Affairs will require all Post 9/11 GI Bill® recipients to verify their enrollment every month.

10. Requirements for In-State Tuition

Students eligible for GI Bill® Educational Benefits below are exempt from paying nonresident tuition regardless of when the veteran separated from the military:

- Montgomery GI Bill®: Active-Duty Program (Chapter 30)
- Veterans Readiness and Employment Program (Chapter 31)
- Post-9/11 GI Bill® Program (Chapter 33)

If you completed your active duty outside of California, please complete the AB13 VACA Affidavit and a copy of your DD214 and email to admissions@marin.edu

11. Prohibition of Automatic Enrollment Certification

Students are required to submit the Request for Benefits form along with an updated Educational Plan (approved and signed by a COM veteran Counselor) after registration starts in order for their classes to be verified by the VA Certifying Official. Send your documents to mbarnett@marin.edu.

Classes will not be automatically certified without the required documents.

12. Absence Due to Military Service

Students who are members of an active or reserve U.S. military service who receive orders compelling a withdrawal from courses are eligible to receive a "Military Withdrawal" symbol on their academic records.

Once orders are verified, "MW" may be assigned unless academic credit has been awarded. The "MW" shall not be counted in progress prohibition, dismissal procedures, and disqualification calculations.

If you receive orders, please contact the Enrollment Services Office. Complete the General Petition in your MyCOM portal along with a copy of your orders.
